Building and Facilities

Camera System

A vendor that I had been in touch with did not return phone calls or e-mails and I had to solicit a proposal from another vendor (I met with them this week and am awaiting their proposal). I will be moving forward selecting the new system as soon as possible.

LED Lighting Project

I have been in contact with another vendor that submitted a previous proposal and will be meeting with them for an updated quote early next week. I expect to make a decision and move forward with this project soon.

Trash and Recycling

The library has been receiving complaints from neighbors regarding paper trash. Paper from the recycling bins blows out of the containers on windy days and the problem gets worse as the containers fill. Two weeks ago, a neighbor called Supervisor Olson and we met last week to discuss the problem and potential solutions. I have contacted the company that owns the bins to discuss mitigating the paper problem and I am investigating options for a library-only large paper recycling container.

Door Count and Circulation

Visitor count for February 2017 is 16,766. This is a decrease of increase of 461 visitors compared to January but an overall increase of 3,297 visitors (9.7%) compared to the year to date data from last year.

One staff member is out on maternity until March and another resigned mid February. Due to this staffing shortage we did not host any special preschool programs in February. The 2nd annual Winter Readin Club (family read-aloud story time) was a success and we had a total of 125 participants.

Teen Notes

Our college series, Understanding & Demystifying College Admissions, was held to help students/parents get information and gain confidence going into the college admissions process. Topics included: how to select a college, what colleges seek in applicants, college admissions tests and requirements, hot topics and trends in admissions, and financial aid. This informative and fun series was led by an experienced college counselor and former college admissions officer & dean, Cigus Vanni.

The library hosted an informational night and expert panel on PSSA testing in TESD. The evening focused on questions such as: What is the benefit for children taking PSSA's? Why is so much classroom time devoted to PSSA preparation and testing? How can we support our teachers & schools? Who is supporting high-stakes standardized testing? There was a great turnout from the school administration, the school board, and the public.

Social events included a CHS concert Compositions for a Cause, two middle school book group meetings, and a middle school games and improv Saturday night.

Reference

We are currently interviewing for a part-time reference position. February & March saw increases in requests for proctoring & one-on-one tutorials. The 2nd year of March Madness is winding down & has been popular. Final four voting is open until Monday, March 27.
