Library Director's Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for December 7, 2017

Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and services and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing January – November 2016 to January – November 2017, total volunteers increased by 19.3% (81 more total volunteers) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 12.9% (531.5 more volunteer contributed hours).

Building and Facilities

LED Lighting Project

To date, about half of the new LED fixtures have been installed in the Children's Department. I am awaiting a call from the installer to schedule dates for the remainder of the installation.

Stucco Repair

The Assistant Township Manager, Director of Finance, and I reviewed the building plans with an architect and it was recommended that the block in the wall be checked for deterioration prior to fixing the stucco. The

Township's Public Works Department has excavated behind the wall and determined that the block is intact. Moving forward, the rear of the wall will be excavated, filled with stone, drainage pipes will be checked and replaced if needed, the flagstone capping will be replaced and sealed, and the stucco will be repaired. Public Works is obtaining additional quotes for the stucco wall repair.

Visitor Count and Circulation

Visitor count for November 2017 totaled 18,472. This is a decrease of 300 (1.6%) compared to October 2017. Comparing January - November 2016 to January - November 2017, an overall increase in visitor count of 5,452 (2.6%) has been recorded.

This is an increase of 66 (<1%) in borrowing of print materials and an increase of 31 (1%) in borrowing of electronic materials (eBooks) compared to the previous month. Comparing January – November of 2016 to January - November of 2017, total circulation of library materials has increased overall by 2,381 (.7%).

Children's Notes (Submitted by Angie Andre)

We saw 72 friends for our Halloween Monster Bash Celebration.

Spanish and English Bilingual Story Time continues to be a success as we see new friends each session.

Outreach to Valley Forge Montessouri Michele Bolay saw 34 children and they graciously gave us a donation of \$100.

Turnover for a children's page is high and we are again looking for someone to shelve books in the Children's Department.

The upgrade to LED lighting in the Children's Department has made an enormous difference in bringing light into the stacks.

We hosted over 100 third grade students from Hillside elementary school. We gave them a tour of the library and conducted a fun scavenger hunt to test their knowledge. We are doing a library card drive with them. After the third grade class fills out their applications they will encourage students in other grades to also get a library card. We will be processing in their applications in the weeks to come.

Our Back to Basics Baking and Sewing classes continue to be a success. We are trying to fill a need for basic skills that the schools are unable to provide.

We held our first Breakout and the 17 participating students broke out of Mr. Lemoncellos library in 20 minutes. We also hosted a girl scout troop and allowed them to borrow our breakout kit. They earned a cooperation badge and broke into the box in 30 minutes.

We ended November with 26 programs and 646 attendees.

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

In October, New York Comic Con and The New York Public Library offered educators and librarians an exclusive day of panels, networking, and workshops. I was able to attend this event and spend a day at the larger Comic Con thanks to the Friends of Tredyffrin Public Library.

I arrived at the NYPL early and was one of the first 250 attendees to tap my badge to get NYPL giveaways for the teens. The keynote speakers were Laurie Halse Anderson (Speak,) and Ngozi Ukazu (Check, Please!). I attended panel sessions including: Diversity in Coming-of-Age Comics & Graphic Novels, Women in Comics: Celebrating Over 100 Years, Collection Development and Readers Advisory, and a pro-level networking session to help create connections between comic book creators and librarians.

The show floor featured hundreds of exhibitors many of whom were happy to talk with me about graphic novels and manga for our collection. From to Dark Horse Comics to Disney, I spoke with publishers I was familiar with and introduced myself to some I wasn't.

The professional track programming at Comic Con went beyond my expectations and will certainly factor into my talks with teens about this popular art form.

We held our usual bi-monthly book group where we discussed Etiquette & Espionage by Gail Carriger and our bi-monthly journaling together workshops.

We had an evening Halloween party with ghost stories and charades.

A meeting was held with Conestoga students to discuss Winter Ball.

To better understand struggling readers, I attended the BUILD (Better Understanding of Individuals with Learning Differences) sponsored Experience Dyslexia®, a Simulation in conjunction with the PA branch of the International Dyslexia Association held at VFMS. In addition to the six activities mimicking the experiences and processes of those with dyslexia, the discussion included the neurological basis of dyslexia, the warning signs, and interventions.

In November, we kicked of our Girls Who Code club programs for 6-12th grade girls to use computer science to impact their community. This is a student run club with a parent advisor and library sponsorship. The club is full and meets every Saturday.

We held our usual bi-monthly book group where we discussed Carve the Mark by Veronica Roth and our bi-monthly journaling together workshops.

I attended the WHYY Youth Media Awards ceremony in Philadelphia with a student and her family. I am happy to say that her group won first place in the Middle School Documentary/News category. I am also happy to say that a group of students from Conestoga won first prize in the High School Narrative category.
