# Library Director's Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for April 26, 2018

#### **Volunteers**

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and services and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing March to February 2018, total volunteers increased by 2 (+4.8%) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 45.75 (12.1%). Comparing 2018 totals to 2017 totals from the same time period, total volunteers increased by 17 (+15.6%) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 150.5 (+15.5%).

# **Building and Facilities**

#### **LED Lighting Project**

The lighting project is complete for the Children's Department. I had initially wanted to install different fixtures in Tyler Hedges and the Red Fox Book Shop, however, sizing of the fixtures presented some difficulty and instead of using LED replacement lights, retrofit kits were installed instead. The new lighting uses LED compatible ballasts (replacing the compact florescent compatible ballasts). While the lighting has roughly the same lumen output, the cost associated with operating the lights should drop by approximately half.

#### **Stucco Repair**

Nothing new to report. We are anticipating moving forward soon.

#### **Parking Lot**

I received a quote to have the parking lot re-sealed and new lines painted. I am currently working with the Township Public Works Department to get this scheduled.

#### Recycling

I continue to have issues with the Paper Retriever bins being emptied and have been unsuccessful in getting them removed from the parking lot. The company has been notified via certified letter that they must remove the bins from the property. I also will be contacting the Township Solicitor if this issue persists.

#### **Patio Pavers**

We've had some issues with the patio pavers sinking in (especially on the corners) and I am concerned that they may pose a tripping hazard. I have been working with Tredyffrin Public Works to solicit quotes for reseating the pavers. Installation of any new pavers is on hold until we address this issue.

#### **Security Cameras**

I had received a quote to install two additional security cameras in the parking lot at Tredyfrin. The installer attempted to run from the exterior of the building to the interior and discovered a clear underground path through a conduit was not available. I'm currently looking in to the feasibility of installing two wireless cameras in the library parking lot.

# **Visitor Count and Circulation**

Visitor count for March 2018 totaled 19,547. This is an increase of 2,986 (+18%) visitors compared to February 2018 and an increase of 42 (+.1%) comparing January – March 2017 to January – March 2018. Please note that Wednesdays total at Tredyffrin for March is higher than expected due to a program that was held in the library Wednesday, March  $14^{th}$ .

Circulation for March 2018 totaled 33,492 for all materials. This is an increase of 3,950 (+13.4 %) in borrowing of materials compared to the previous month. Comparing all year-to-date checkouts through March from 2018 to 2017 (using the percentage distribution for Overdrive material), total circulation of library materials increased by 5,960 (6.8%).

Children ages 8-12 learned to sign the alphabet their name, and basic phrases. We are planning another meeting next month. The Friends of TPL have sponsored Angle in taking sign language classes at the deaf and Hearing Communication Center in Swarthmore. Michele offered a LEGO and Lunch program also during spring break with many children building.

# Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

In March, we held our usual bi-monthly book group where we discussed Geekerella: A Fangirl Fairy Tale Book by Ashley Poston. In addition, we held our bi-monthly journaling together workshops. We held our Girls Who Code Club expo and graduation.

In addition, CHS students held a concert to raise money for their spring break Music education/Mission Trip to Ecuador. Their goal was to give smiles (sonrisas) to the kids in the Amazon jungle. They sent the library a report of the trip and appreciation for the use of our venue.

Here are a few highlights from the trip.

- Our first trip, at the end of March 2018, focused on music education. We held concerts in several cities to bring the gift of music to the people in the Ecuador.
- In Our 7 day trip, we held 7 concerts that supported 4 missionaries in the mountain, city and jungle area. Approximately 1500 Ecuadorians listened our music.
- We raised \$1000 for the trip; we donated a cello (\$500) to a missionary/musician, the remaining \$500 was divided and given to 6 different mission fields.

#### Reference

Congratulations to Zoey Mills & Ann Duffy, both of whom are recognized as All-stars through the American Library Association during National Library Week.

The majority of the staff participated in making READ posters, highlighting books or other materials that we keep in our collection. These posters are currently on display on the front of our old information desk and have been a big hit, creating dialogues between staff and patrons and increasing patron interaction on our social media page.

Jonathan Trice has been accepted to attend the Pennsylvania Library Association Leadership Academy in June. His participation will jumpstart a year-long project with other elite state librarians. Congratulations, Jonathan! The part-time reference staff continues to work on adult programming. Programs to highlight mental health awareness in May are in the works.

We are hoping to bring two new reference staff members on board in the coming weeks.

Data collected for information assistance for March 2018 indicates an increase of 226 (+9.9%) information transactions compared to February 2018 and a decrease of 190 (-2.6%) transactions compared to the same time period for 2017. PC use overall has increased by 53 (+1.3%) compared to the previous month and by 1181 (+11.3%) compared to the same time period for 2017. Information literacy classes (1 on 1 sessions) decreased by 9 (+18.4%) compared to the previous month and by 10 (+22.7%) compared to the same time period for 2017. Proctoring sessions decreased by 1 (-11.5%) compared to the same time period for 2017 while hours of proctoring offered increased by 6.5 (+56.5) compared to the same time period for 2017.
