Library Director's Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for July 26, 2018

Monthly Summary

Tredyffrin Public Library is working toward becoming a Gold Star PA Forward Library. Developed by the Pennsylvania Library Association, the PA Forward Star Library Program is part of a statewide initiative whose goal is to improve the quality of life in Pennsylvania. The program enables libraries to create new partnerships; develop broader community support; and develop a powerful, unified voice for libraries as community centers of information, technology and learning that fuel educational and economic opportunity for all.

The program recognizes libraries that incorporate the "five key literacies" - "Basic Literacy", "Information Literacy", "Civic and Social Literacy", "Health Literacy", and "Financial Literacy" into their programming activities, displays and events.

Visitor count for 2018 has decreased by 2,094 (-1.8%) compared to the same time period in 2017. The April and May counts were lower than expected, however, door count numbers have begun to increase as we get into the summer months. We typically see an increase in door count in June, July, and August due to our heavy focus on summer programs for kids. Circulation of library materials for 2018 has increased by 4,914 (+2.7%) compared to the same time period last year. While print circulation has decreased by 2,797 (-1.6%), circulation of electronic materials shows an increase in circulation of 4,914 (+2.7%). As we continue to monitor the changing circulation of print and other physical copies of material we are considering the increasing demand for e-materials and adjusting purchasing of all loan-able library materials in ways that best allocate financial resources and meet the changing demand.

Our program numbers remain strong this year and comparing total offerings and attendance data to the same time period for 2017 there is an overall increase of 116 (+18.5%) in total program offerings and an increase of 541 (+4.9%) in total program attendance. We've experienced some turnover in the Reference Department and are working on bringing on new librarians in the Reference Department to administer adult programming initiatives as we work toward our goal of becoming a Gold Star PA Forward Library.

The Strategic Planning Committee has completed a draft of the 2018 – 2022 Strategic Plan for review.

Building and Facilities Updates

Stucco Repair

The resolution to repair the wall was passed by the Board of Supervisors at the July 16, 2018 meeting. The work is currently scheduled to begin in August.

Recycling

The Paper Retriever program is under new management. I have spoken with and met with the representative and have been assured that the bins would be emptied in a timely manner and that we would be on a regular schedule for pickup. I consulted the Township Manager and we will be keeping the bins for six months on a trial basis anticipating an improvement in service.

Roof Painting

With the aid of Tredyffrin Township Public Works I received quotes to repaint the metal building façade on the roof. The work is tentatively scheduled for August.

Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and services and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing May to June 2018, total volunteers increased by 12 (+30%) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 86 (+22.8%). Comparing 2018 totals to 2017 totals from the same time period, total volunteers increased by 77(+40.7%) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 231.75 (+10.7%).


Visitor Count and Circulation

Visitor count for June 2018 totaled 22,314. This is an increase of 4,014 (+22%) visitors compared to May and a decrease of 2,094 (-1.8%) comparing the 2018 total to the 2017 total.

I've included a comparison of door count data collected by month for the years 2015 - 2018. I though it prudent to include both the data and a graphical representation of how door count has changed (and changes) during the months of the year and also to illustrate the door count changes over the past four years.

Circulation for June 2018 totaled 34,180 for all materials. This is an increase of 4,266 (+14.4 %) in borrowing of materials compared to the previous month. Compared to the total checkouts for 2017, checkouts for 2018 have increased by 4,914 (+2.7%). While print circulation has decreased by 2,797 (-1.6%), circulation of electronic materials shows an increase in circulation of 4,914 (+2.7%). Electronic circulation in the system is attributed by percentage of total contribution to electronic resources by all libraries within the system.

We are making good use of our 30 teen volunteers that are making our amazing summer possible. Our hard working volunteers are spending their time signing up children for summer reading, marking

their progress, shelving books, helping circulation staff check in items and providing help to our programming library assistants.

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

We held our usual bi-monthly book group and "journaling together" workshops. The book this month was "The Confidence Code for Girls." The book includes ideas for regulating stress in a healthy way. Each book group member presented a chapter from the book, adding in her own knowledge.

The "Girls Who Code Club" wrapped up for the summer and will return in the fall.

We hosted a schedule of "end of high school" art galleries and musical recitals. These events showed the breadth and depth of music and arts education in TESD. With music spanning across multiple genres and art spanning multiple styles and mediums, these events brought a capacity crowd to Tredyffrin Library. We celebrated the end of the school year with a "School's Out Pizza Party" which included a tabletop shuffleboard tournament.

We held our first of two scheduled College Essay Summer Writing Classes with Marylyn Calabrese, PH.D. Dr. Calabrese is the former chairperson of the Conestoga High School English Department. Her educational background includes an A.B. from Bryn Mawr College, an MAT from Wesleyan University, and a Ph.D. in Teaching Writing from the University of Pennsylvania. All proceeds from this event went to the library.

Reference Notes (Submitted by Catherine Boyle)

In June we welcomed Sam Bardarik to the reference desk. She will be taking over the weekday hours vacated by Zoey. We now have 4 graduates from the Pennsylvania Library Association's Leadership Academy on the reference staff.

The staff has been hard at work preparing our weekly challenge sheets for SummerQuest as well as prepping for our annual Christmas in July display. Many of the part time reference staff members have been coming up with some exciting ideas for programming. Information assistance for June 2018 shows an increase of 278 (+2%) information transactions compared to the same time period for 2017. PC use has increased by 998 (+4.7%) compared to the same time period for 2017. Information literacy classes (1 on 1 sessions) decreased by 17 (-25.4%) compared to the same time period for 2017. Proctoring sessions decreased by 2 (-6.9%) compared to the same time period for 2017 while hours of proctoring offered increased by 4.25 (+10.3%) compared to the same time period for 2017.
