Library Director's Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for August 23, 2018

Monthly Summary

Tredyffrin Public Library continues working toward becoming a Gold Star PA Forward Library and we are close to earning a bronze star. Developed by the Pennsylvania Library Association, the PA Forward Star Library Program is part of a statewide initiative whose goal is to improve the quality of life in Pennsylvania. The program enables libraries to create new partnerships; develop broader community support; and develop a powerful, unified voice for libraries as community centers of information, technology and learning that fuel educational and economic opportunity for all.

Visitor count for 2018 has decreased by 2,176 (-1.6%) compared to the same time period in 2017. While we typically see an increase in door count in June, July, and August due to our heavy focus on summer programs for kids, the summer months saw fewer visitors compared to 2017. It is important to note however that visitor counts have increased since 2015 and 2018 numbers fall somewhere between 2016 and 2017. Circulation of library materials for 2018 has increased by 8,617 (+4.0%) compared to the same time period last year. While print circulation has decreased by 3,380 (-1.7%), circulation of electronic materials shows an increase in of 11,997 (+91.3%). As we continue to monitor the changing circulation of print and other physical copies of material we are also gauging the demand for e-materials and adjusting purchasing of all loan-able library materials in ways that best allocate financial resources and meet the changing demand. Compared to the same time period for 2017, program offerings increased by 136 (+18.1%) and program attendance increased by 1,684 (+13.3%). Information assistance for July 2018 indicates a decrease of 312 (-1.8%) transactions. PC use overall has been increasing and total use increased by 811 (+3.2%). Information literacy classes (1 on 1 sessions) decreased by 28 (-66.7%) compared to the same time period for 2017.

Building and Facilities

Stucco Repair

The repairs work has started. The estimated timeframe for completion is not yet known but expected to be as soon as is possible.

Recycling

We had no problems with this service the month of July.

Roof Painting

With the aid of Tredyffrin Township Public Works I received quotes to repaint the metal building façade on the roof. The work tentatively scheduled for August has been pushed back to early September.

Lighting

Tredyffrin Public Library has received a \$1,000 grant from PECO to continue work on the Children's Department LED lighting conversion. All of the 4 ft. florescent lighting fixtures in the public areas (except for restrooms) was completed early this year. I am looking into spending remaining capital funds on replacing the 4", 6", and 8" recessed lights in the public areas with LED lights or LED compatible fixtures.

Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and services and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing June to July 2018, total volunteers decreased by 11 (-21.2%) and total volunteer contributed hours decreased by 107.25 (-22.3%). Comparing 2018 totals to 2017 totals from the same time period, total volunteers increased by 10(+3.4%) and total volunteer contributed hours increased by 126 (+4.8%).


Visitor Count and Circulation

Visitor count for July 2018 totaled 21,773. This is a decrease of 541 (-2.4%) visitors compared to June 2018 and a decrease of 2,176 (-1.6%) comparing the 2018 total to the 2017 total.

Circulation for July 2018 totaled 37,196 for all materials. This is an increase of 3,016 (+8.8 %) in borrowing of materials compared to the previous month. Compared to the total checkouts for 2017, checkouts in 2018 have increased by 8,617 (+4%). While print circulation has decreased by 3,380 (-1.7%), circulation of electronic materials shows a significant increase of 11,997 (+91.3%). Electronic circulation in the system is attributed by percentage of total contribution to electronic resources by all libraries within the system. It should also be noted that Tredyffrin Public Library has been adjusting collection purchasing to meet the increased demand for electronic books and electronic audiobooks. It will be important moving forward to continue to balance our electronic materials purchases with print as there are still many users that borrow print, DVDs, and books on CD and because it provides a reasonable way for patrons to obtain titles that are unavailable electronically or available electronically but with long wait times.

Children's Notes (Submitted by Angie Andre)

We started off our Summer Reading Quest this year with a successful Kickoff Party on Friday, June 16 and registered 130 children from birth -12 years old that day alone, bringing total registrations to 616. This year, at the recommendation of the Commonwealth of PA libraries, we included activities into our regular program. This year children could earn extra raffle tickets attending library programs, reading to a friend, telling a joke, reading in nature and much more. These activities were literacy and learning based and added an extra element of fun and adventure to the program.

In partnership with Glaxo Smith Kline and the Franklin Institute the library hosted another year of Science in the Summer. The theme this year was The Science of Space. Mr. Leary, a middle school teacher from Avon Grove, was our Science in the Summer instructor teaching 31 children in grades 2-6 about space using many hands-on activities. On the one day it did not rain the children had the opportunity to go outside and build rockets.

July is the busiest month for the Children's Department and we offered 68 programs with 1665 in attendance. Some of the highlighted programs were:

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

Programs for teens in July included Board Game Night, where students leave their devices at home and relax (or get intense) playing board games. Their choice. An inaugural Friday Night Puzzle Fight with each team receiving the same puzzle and competing to see who could put it together faster! (Extremely quiet and incredibly focused/teams finished identical 500 piece puzzles within 3 minutes of each other).

The Tredyffrin Library Teen Leadership Summit including a series of fun exercises for "the future leader in you."

We held our usual bi-monthly book group and "journaling together" workshops. The book this month was Scythe by Neal Shusterman.

We continue to offer our Reading Excellence Award for young readers wishing to expand their reading lens beyond the United States and read "Around the World." Students who complete the program receive a special award from the library.

The College Essay Summer Writing Class with Marylyn Calabrese, PH.D. was a success. Dr. Calabrese is the former chairperson of the Conestoga High School English Department. Her educational background includes an A.B. from Bryn Mawr College, an MAT from Wesleyan University, and a Ph.D. in Teaching Writing from the University of Pennsylvania. For the past two summers, she has generously donated her time and all tuition monies came to the library.

Reference Notes (Submitted by Catherine Boyle)

We've had a number of BYU students wanting to be proctored at the library. So many that we've rethought our proctoring procedures to include an online form & the request that students donate \$10 to the library starting August 1. In July, I saw 21 separate students which has also caused me to choose specific times where I will proctor and take multiple students at a time.

This has been working very well & parents/students continue to be thankful for the service. They have all been very willing to donate to the library and in some cases has donated more than the suggested \$10.

Data collected for information assistance for July 2018 indicates a decrease of 216 (-8.0%) information transactions compared to June 2018 and a decrease of 312 (-1.8%) transactions compared to the same time

period for 2017. PC use overall has increased by 106 (+3.1%) compared to the previous month and has increased by 811 (+3.2%) compared to the same time period for 2017. Information literacy classes (1 on 1 sessions) decreased by 15 (-62.5%) compared to the previous month and decreased by 28 (-66.7%) compared to the same time period for 2017.
