# Library Director's Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for March 28, 2019

#### **Volunteers**

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing 2019 to 2018, total number of volunteers increased by 5 (+11.1%) and volunteer contributed hours decreased by 56.75 (-15.3%).

I am still investigating utilizing cell phone boosters inside Tredyffrin Public Library and considering viable solutions. I have not made progress on this as some other matters needed my attention.

Tredyffrin Library continues to experience functionality issues with the HVAC system. I am awaiting scheduling for service to get the air conditioning running again.

The new semi-private cubicle purchase was approved by the Board of Supervisors. I am working on finalizing the details and expect to have an installation date scheduled soon.

Tredyffrin Public Library's roof continues to have issues. Currently, the roofer that we were working with has indicated that he can no longer locate and patch areas of the flat roof. There is currently an active leak in the lobby.


On Monday, February 17<sup>th</sup>, the small water heater in the Children's Department (under the sink in the restroom) failed and there was a small flood in the restroom and water did seep into the surrounding carpet. A remediation company was brought in to dry out the area. The water heater has been replaced.

We've been having problems with the entrance door in the Children's Department not closing properly and with the terrace door not sealing properly. We have received a quote to have both doors repaired in order to make them functional.

## **Visitor Count**

Visitor count for February 2019 totaled 16,585. This is an increase of 24 (+0.1%) comparing total visitor count in February 2019 to that of February 2018.

## Circulation

Circulation for February 2019 totaled 30,670. Compared to the previous February, checkouts of library material increased by 5,732 (+21.5%). While print circulation increased by 2,457 (+10.3%), circulation of electronic materials increased by 1,501 (+511%). Electronic materials circulation statistics for libraries in the Chester County Library System are based on total individual library contribution to the collection. Compared to 2018, circulation of all library material has increased by 3,122 (+5.2%).

## **Programming**



Tredyffrin Library was proud to host the launch party for Conestoga High School's literary magazine's winter issue of The Folio. Literary Magazine is a Co-Curricular course during which students produce the school literary magazine. Inkwell Coffeehouse in Strafford has become their tradition to launch the winter issue of the Folio.

We supported participants of the Conestoga High School Mini-THON® 2019 by hosting their event for elementary school students to raise money to support their dance marathon. The young participants had a fun night of art & crafts and fun & games. They also created a banner that will be hung at the dance. CHS students are joining more than 90,000 students across the country in the fight to conquer childhood cancer.

Technologically, we hosted techgirlz for a Models and Molecules workshop. Co-taught by a CHS student, in this workshop, we worked with different types of molecular models. We learned how scientists use these to

understand synthetic and natural molecules, including those of living organisms. We worked with models of interesting molecules and learned how computers help scientific discovery.

There were regular meetings of Journaling Together Group, Book Group and K-Pop. Teen Book Club began reading Sad Perfect by Stephanie Elliot. TEEN K-POP DANCE CREW continued to rehearse their dances for a Dance and Korean Cultural Program to be held at a future date.

I attended a presentation on Marijuana, Vaping, Opioids & Other Drugs that was sponsored by ARCH and was held at T/E Middle School.
