



Library Director’s Report to Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for July 25, 2019

Personnel Updates

- Zoey Mills has been hired as our new Community Outreach and Adult Programs Librarian. Zoey began working part time at Tredyffrin Public Library’s Reference Desk in 2016 and has worked in the Chester County Library System since 2015.
- We have hired a number of additional part time staff to cover desk hours for opening the main library on Wednesdays for the remainder of 2019.

Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing 2019 to 2018, total number of volunteers increased by 4 (+1.4%) and volunteer contributed hours increased by 336.6 (+15.0%).

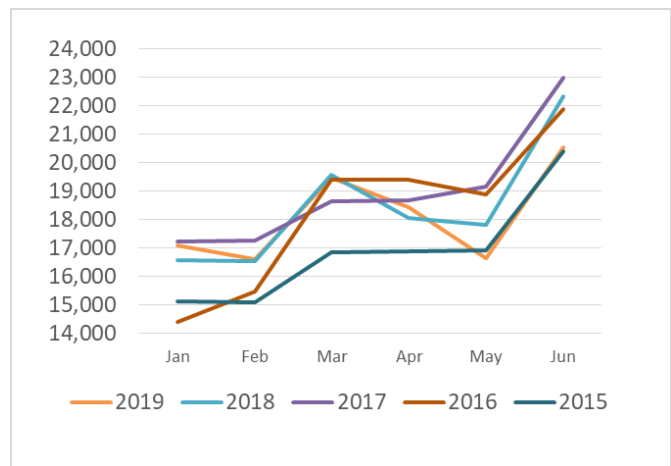
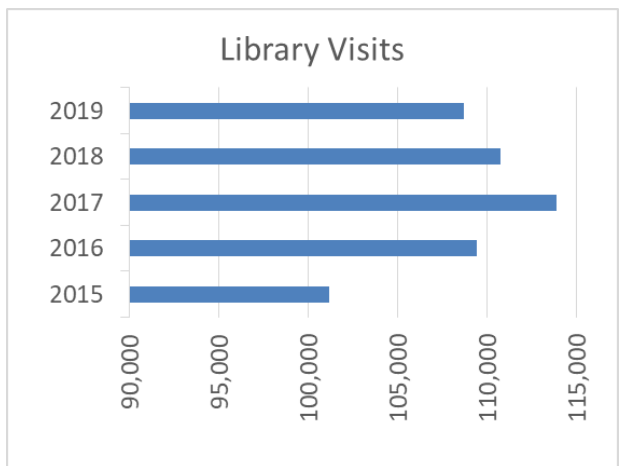
Visitor count for June 2019 totaled 20,531. This is a decrease of 2,601 (-2.3%) comparing total visitor count in 2019 to that of 2018.

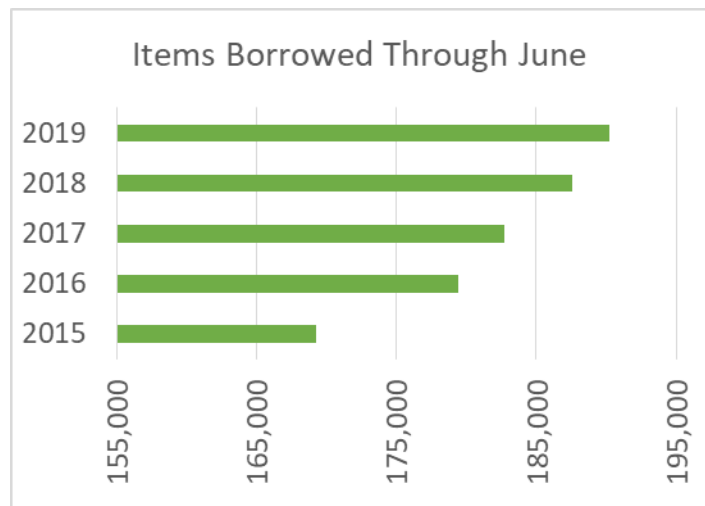
Circulation

Circulation for June 2019 totaled 32,899. Compared to the previous June, checkouts of library material decreased by 1,281 (-3.7%). Print circulation decreased by 2,609 (-8.6%) while circulation of electronic materials increased by 1,328 (+35%). Comparing 2019 to 2018, total circulation increased by 4,141 (+3.4%). Print circulation decreased by 2,704 (-2.0%) while circulation of electronic materials has decreased by 1,281 (-3.7%). Please note that electronic materials circulation statistics for libraries in the Chester County Library System are based on total individual library contribution to the collection.

Programming

Programs for June 2019 totaled 136 and attendance totaled 4,033. Included in this program statistics collection are programs conducted off-site (outreach). While we've recorded these programs previously in the Chester County program statistics collection, I have not included them in the Board statistics. Comparing total program offerings and attendance to 2018, there is an overall increase of 226 (+45.8%) in total program offerings and an increase of 4,067 (+61.4%) in total program attendance.

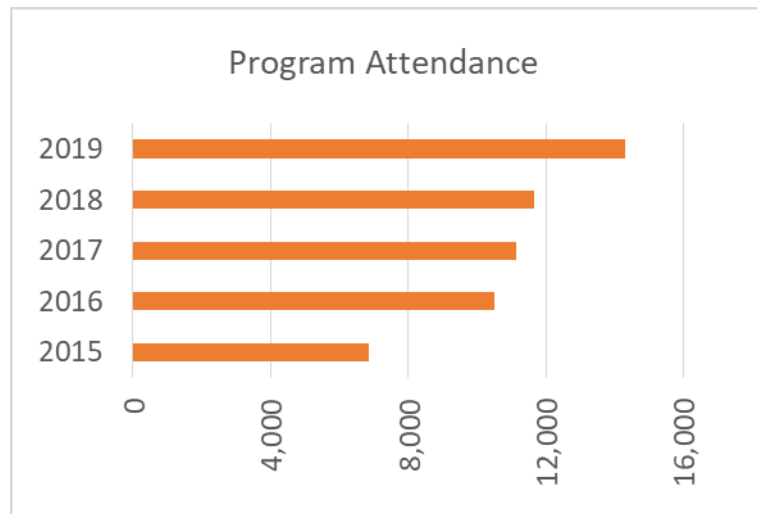

Children's Notes (Submitted by Angie Andre)

Children's Librarian, Angie Andre, participated in the Pennsylvania Library Association Academy of Leadership Studies in Harrisburg. She helped to plan and facilitate, Choosing Leadership, this one day program for library staff members from all over Pennsylvania who wanted to learn more about becoming a leader.

Visiting the local elementary schools was a priority for early June and Angie visited Hillside Elementary and New Eagle Elementary. She was able to share the summer reading program and activities with over 500 students.

We've changed the structure of our Summer Reading Program this year and are participating in Summer Quest: Patch Power, a new program that blends reading, participation, crafts, and family interaction. This program is intended to encourage children who may not be enthusiastic readers to participate in our summer program to a greater extent and in different ways by completing literacy related activities and projects. While the program still encompasses book reading, the extra components encourage social interaction, storytelling, and creative expression to complete objectives and earn patches.

Our Summer Reading Kickoff was Friday, June 26 and unfortunately year we saw fewer participants than in past years. We registered 80 children and saw a total of 160 participants in the day's events. The decline is likely due to changes in the program and issues with some materials. We may reconsider continuing with this patch program next year depending on the results of the program this year. By the end of June we had almost 300 children registered for our summer reading program.

We held a successful Drag Queen Storytime on Friday June 27 at 10:30 am. We saw more than 80 friends who enjoyed stories, rhymes, songs and crafts led by Drag Queen Balena Canto.

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

The Teen Department hosted the "Sounds of Spring with Surrey" concert featuring the Surrey Services Choral, Orchestra, and Chimes groups. Teen volunteer, Emily, was a gracious hostess making sure everyone was comfortable and coordinating the refreshments so they were ready right when the concert ended and the applause died down.

Marylyn Calabrese, PhD, writing coach and former Chairperson of the Conestoga High School English Department held a four day long workshop to help students prepare a successful college application essay. Dr. Calabrese's educational background includes an A.B. from Bryn Mawr College, an MAT from Wesleyan

University, and a PhD in Teaching Writing from the University of Pennsylvania. She has generously donated all proceeds from this class and previous years' classes to the library as a fundraiser.

On the advice of a teacher, the teen department started "Keeping It Going: Summer Review Program." Billed as a fun and engaging 10 session academic review for rising 7th-9th graders it features Reading, Writing, Mathematics, and Mindfulness.

Socially, we held a "Gingerbread Beach House" program where students competed to design the most original, or beautiful, or ugly beach house made in the traditional gingerbread style. We supplied the house kit and edible decorations but students were told they could bring their own unique decorations as well. Prizes were awarded.

Reference Notes (Submitted by Kate Boyle)

The reference staff continues to see an increase, though slight in information interactions at the reference desk. They also continue to help with programs and other projects. Jonathan was happy to report an increase in movie goes this summer and we are delighted that Zoey is transitioning from PT ref staff to our new full-time Adult Programmer and Community Outreach Librarian. Zoey plans to continue to rely on the reference staff for programming help.

We are continuing to see somewhat slow attendance at our Information literacy classes, with patrons tending to prefer one-on-one sessions with our librarians. We're hoping to do more regular tech-drop-in sessions. The high number of attendees this month has to do with a contracted class on Family Tree Maker. Marianne Hooper organized this program and had approximately 100 attendees.

We gladly announce the hiring of Alexandra Srolis as a new reference assistant. Ms. Srolis joined the reference team at the end of June and is already making her mark. She has started a morning ELL class using her experience as an ELL teacher. She is also in the process of obtaining her MLIS. Additionally, we are waiting to bring on Chelsea Post who will also be taking on some hours once she completes paperwork with the township.
