

Library Director's Report to the Tredyffrin Libraries Board of Trustees for October 24, 2019

Building Updates

- The water heater was replaced in the Tyler Hedges Room and then failed again. We're waiting on a replacement.
- Still waiting for a quote for water bottle refill stations in the lobby and Children's Department.
- Cell phone booster has been received, installation will happen in the near future.
- The stucco is being repaired at the emergency exit adjacent to the stairs leading down to the Children's Department.
- Tredyffrin Public Library received a Keystone matching grant in the amount of \$50,000 for LED lighting. This match of the Township's \$50,000 commitment means that we will be able to undertake a lighting replacement project in 2020 to replace all the lighting on the main floor of the library with energy efficient LED lighting.
- A few repairs to the HVAC system have been completed.
- Tredyffrin Public Library will receive a diesel backup generator before the end of the year. The concrete pad has been poured and the generator will be placed on the pad, wired in, and surrounded by a shed. This generator will replace the library's current UPS backup which runs only the elevator, alarm panels, and emergency lighting. The new generator has the potential to turn the library into an Emergency Operations Center for the Township.

Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. We are extremely grateful for their hard work and commitment. Comparing 2019 to 2018, total number of volunteers increased by 58 (+14.1%) and volunteer contributed hours increased by 1,098.5 (+32.9%).


Visitor Count

Circulation

Circulation for September 2019 totaled 31,093. Compared to the previous September, checkouts of library material increased by 3,385 (+1.2%). Comparing 2019 to 2018, total circulation increased by 3,385 (+1.2%). Print circulation decreased by 7,821 (-3.1%) and circulation of electronic materials has increased by 3.385 (+1.2%). Electronic materials circulation statistics for libraries in the Chester County Library System are based on individual library contribution to the collection.



We started our Fall Program session on Monday, September 16 and it will run 8 weeks ending on Friday, November 8.

New to our session is a Parent and Child Yoga class that fosters socialization for children ages 4 and under and a time for parents to interact, relax and unwind.

We provided a special Breakout Program for Tredyffrin Easttown children on their day off on Monday, September 30. We are continuing with our popular ART Appreciation and STEAM programs throughout the session.

We hired Sharifa Victor for our open Children's Circulation Position. Sharifa will be attending Drexel University in pursuit of her MLS starting January 2020.

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

In August, we held two major theatre events, These events not only honed performance skills, they taught communication, problem solving, working together cooperatively, working independently, meeting deadlines, following rules, discipline, responsibility, dedication, etc.

EDGES, by Pasek and Paul, is a song-cycle about coming of age, growth and self-discovery. Produced by Tredyffrin Public Library, Edges was entirely directed, musically directed, performed and conceived by college students. Many members of the community came out to support this effort including teachers and administrators from TESD and the Woodlynde School.

The 6th annual Performance Arts Summer Camp (which began in July) wrapped up on August 10th. Comments from parents included, "We're very grateful to have gotten the cancellation spot! Charlotte had a fabulous time with the campers and counselors. Please do keep us on the list for when signups open next year", "We can't thank you enough! What a wonderful camp! Max had an amazing time! We are so grateful to you, the counselors, and the rest of the campers for a truly fantastic experience." From a teacher, "I was in awe of the camp participants this year! Amazing! All I could think of was that the world is going to be in great hands."

We partnered with techgirlz on the Models And Molecules workshop. "Everything we see and touch is made of atoms and molecules. But they are too small to see directly. As a result, we often use models to better understand molecules." In this workshop, we worked with different types of molecular models. We learned how scientists use these to understand synthetic and natural molecules, including those of living organisms. We worked with models of interesting molecules and learned how computers help scientific discovery. I was invited to the Band Reveal Night at Conestoga High School. The largest student organization at Conestoga, the Marching Pioneers wowed us with their performance of selections from "The Phantom of the Opera."

Finally in August, we held a "Schools on Deck" dinner on the patio. This relaxed event gave us the chance to unwind from summer activities and enjoy an al fresco dinner before the days grow shorter and the temperature drops.

In September, I attended the ARCH (Area Residents Caring & Helping) meeting at the school administration building. These meetings are great for keeping up with a precarious world today where teens are confronted with so many challenges including peer pressure, substance abuse, mental health issues, academic and social pressures and the challenge of finding their place in the world. ARCH is presenting, "Anxiety & Depression in Students" on Monday, 11/11/19 at 7pm at Conestoga High School.

Finally we hosted one of our premier events, "Writing the WOW College Essay" to find out what makes a successful admissions essay with Dr. Marylyn Calabrese. This event is always held one week after the Conestoga High School "CHS: College Application Evening." The engaging program was well attended and

students left the presentation with a detailed hand out and the coaching needed to tackle this important piece of the college application process.
