Volunteers

Volunteers aid us with daily library operations and enable us to continue to provide exemplary service to our community. Comparing 2019 to 2018 (through October), total number of volunteers increased by 52 (+11.5%) and volunteer contributed hours increased by 1,172.25 (+31.8%).





Circulation

Circulation for November 2019 totaled 29,979. Compared to the previous November, checkouts of library material increased by 2,272 (+7.8%). Comparing 2019 to 2018, total circulation has increased by 5,413 (+1.6%). Print circulation has decreased by 7,616 (-2.5%) and circulation of electronic materials has increased by 13,029 (+31.6%). Electronic materials circulation statistics for libraries in the Chester County Library System are based on individual library contribution to the collection.



Children's Notes (Submitted by Angie Andre)

The Children's Department would like to thank the Friends of Tredyffrin Public Library for their donation of greatly needed furniture and carpet replacements. With funds from the Friends we replaced 6 chairs and 2 large carpets. The Friends also had the floors in Tyler Hedges Story Room professionally cleaned.

In November the Children's Department provided 33 programs to 897 patrons. We introduced a new Elementary Age book Club on Wednesdays and a weekend story time for older children. We hosted the 3rd grade class from Hillside Elementary and provided a tour of the department. In partnership with the Tredyffrin Easttown School District we hosted our "Libraries are for Everyone" Art Reception. We provided refreshments and met 95 children and their families as they viewed the puzzle pieces they created to share their love of libraries. This event happened at Paoli Library as well as Easttown Library on the same night, November 7.

Teen Notes (Submitted by Laura Doan)

Teens in October held a "History Roundtable: History Overlooked". Stoga Chamber Music held a benefit concert for the Gwynedd nursing home. We kicked of our Technology Mentoring Series with UIF and our Girls Who Code Club Fall Session. We began rehearsing our "Reading Dickens" play. We continued our weekly Jornaling/Reading clubs.

In November, we continued with UIF, Girls Who Code, rehearsals for the play, book and journaling group. I attended the ESL Family Night at CHS where Zoey Mills and I ran a fun photo booth. I also attended high school plays at Radnor (a student volunteer was in the play), Agnes Irwin (another student volunteer was in the play), and, of course, CHS!

In addition to programming, I attended the ARCH meetings and their presentation of "Minding Your Mind: Anxiety & Depression". Speaker Andrew, a MYM speaker spoke to parents about his struggle with anxiety and depression and how he found the help he needed. Andrew spoke to CHS 11th & 12th graders earlier in the day.

Adult Programs and Community Outreach Notes (Submitted by Zoey Mills)

In November, Tredyffrin Public Library provided a total of 20 special programs for 443 patrons, and a total of 49 recurring programs for 467 patrons. In total, we held 69 programs for 910 adult patrons. In November, the library participated in International Games Week by offering special programs, like Life-Size Clue, Stranger Things Escape Room, Rent-One-Get-One special on video games, and continuing our popular Community Puzzle. Our most attended program was the Dilwali Celebration. The library saw over 150 patrons that day. Comments from various program evaluation cards include—"[We] very much enjoyed [the program]. Engaging activity, participants had fun even though most [were] strangers to each other" from a participant during International Games Week: Life-Size Clue; "Yes, [I enjoyed the program]! Great categories and enthusiastic hostess" from a participant during 21+ Trivia Night at La Cabra Brewing.

In addition, we held 2 outreach programs—21+ Trivia Night at La Cabra Brewing for 39 patrons, and "Create a Story" program in partnership with Devereux for 4 patrons. The 21+ Trivia Night at La Cabra will continue in January on a monthly recurring basis. Both La Cabra and the library are happy with the turn out and the patron response to the program. The Adult Programming and Outreach Librarian also met with Director and Director of External Relations, Tom Smarr and Stephanie Kuniholm, at the Jenkins Arboretum to discuss a partnership and outreach opportunities for the new year. In 2020, we will be strengthening our partnership with Devereux to include a monthly book group which will meet off site at the Devon Starbucks, as well as a monthly Autism-Friendly Trivia Night held at the library.

Reference Notes (Submitted by Kate Boyle)

In November, we saw a transition from our old & expensive print software (Papercut) to a Envisionware LPT1. This print software is made to pair with our existing computer management software and is designed specifically for library use. It was a rough beginning, but so far, most patrons are finding the new system easier to use intuitively. With approximately one year left on our printer contract, this system is idea for any transition we might choose to make. I'm currently weighing the options between three companies to replace the printers come next October.

Scott Wilgis from computer services made the annual tech visit and installed some changes on our staff and public PCs. Moving forward, it is CCLS's plan that each staff member or volunteer will personally login to which ever computer they use, including the circ & reference machines. Not sure how this will work, but will update when I speak more to Tony Wagner.

Our upstairs marquee is on the fritz. I believe that the connection to the basement computer has gone bad and I am evaluating options that will make our marquee more up-to-date and easier to update. My hope is that we will not have to replace the Windows 7 machine in our basement.

Please enjoy the updated program videos page on our website. Gene Donahue from the township has been kind enough to videotape and air some of our popular programs, like the visit from John Grogan and Dr. Jim Casey's 'Spooky Shakespeare.'

Our newly revamped AdLib is seeing some impressive numbers, I am thrilled to report. Each week we are seeing an 8 - 10% click rate, sending patrons to register for programs or explore more of what we offer. This is an increase of 2 - 3 % and makes me feel confident that the more streamlined version has found some early success.

Finally, I'd like to take a moment to thank the reference staff for their excellent work this year. From program development, to data entry or display planning, every member of the staff has worked hard to make sure each patron feels enriched by the presence of a professional (or soon-to-be) librarian. Our part-time staff includes Sam Bardarik, Taylor Baugher, Gretchen Chamberlin, Loretta Deierlein, Ann Duffy, Marianne Hooper, Dominique Lewis, Chelsea Post, Alex Srolis, Chris Swisher, and Jonathan Trice.
