

Director's Report to the Library Board of Trustees December 10, 2020

The Libraries continue to mitigate operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic and are currently not offering public access to the building and have extended curbside pickup hours as follows:

Tredyffrin:

- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday 10 am 7 pm
- Friday 10 am 2 pm
- Saturday 10 am − 2 pm
- CLOSED Sundays

Paoli:

- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday 10 am 5 pm
- Friday 10 am 2 pm
- Saturday 10 am 2 pm
- CLOSED Sundays

Currently, 9 out of 18 library buildings in the Chester County Library System are closed to public access. 2 of the 9 are offering PC access to some degree by appointment. Some libraries are offering limited public access hours and encouraging only short visits (seating not available). All libraries continue to evaluate the risk of offering in-person library services and are adjusting access accordingly.

Building and Grounds

- I expect to be scheduling the Tredyffrin Public Library's first floor LED lighting replacement soon and plan to have the project completed by March 31, 2021.
- I had to close Tredyffrin Public Library on November 1,2020 due to our HVAC system being disabled. The control board was no longer communicating with the software or the equipment and this caused 2 of 3 air handlers to go completely offline. Herman Goldner was brought in to evaluate the problem and determined that the controller would need to be replaced. They also bypassed the controller and brought all of the air handlers back online. Quotes for the replacement controller and system reprogramming ranged between \$14,000 to \$16,000. Herman Goldner has been contacted to install a replacement controller and reprogram the system I am waiting for a call back to schedule this. The Township has agreed to cover the expense for the replacement.
- Work is currently being performed to patch cracks in the front entrance walkway before the weather gets colder.
- I met with the Tredyffrin Township Environmental Action Committee to discuss ideas for potential stormwater management projects around the library. The EAC has also performed

some maintenance on the plants along the front walkway of the building and re-planted some of the space with native plants.

• I worked with a local Eagle Scout (Aaron Ryder) to help him complete his Eagle Scout Service Project. Aaron pressure washed the area outside the Children's Department and assembled, etched checkboards into, and weather-coated two picnic tables for families to use.

Building Access

For November 2020, 3,560 visits were recorded for Tredyffrin and 987 visits were recorded for Paoli. Comparing 2019 to 2020, library visits have decreased by 143,977. Given the reduced operating hours and decrease in service offerings, door count numbers will remain significantly lower than usual for the remainder of 2020. The Libraries were closed to the public April, May, and June and those months have been excluded from this table.



Circulation



Programming Notes




