

Director's Report to the Library Board of Trustees June 24, 2021

The Libraries continue to mitigate operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic and are currently offering limited public access and curbside pickup hours.

Tredyffrin Public Library is open to the public:

- Monday Thursday 10 am 5 pm
- Friday Saturday 10 am 2 pm

Contactless pickup services include:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday 5 – 7 pm

Paoli Library has a new temporary schedule for in-person browsing and curbside pickup:

- Tuesday & Thursday 10 am 5 pm
- Saturday 10 am − 2 pm
- CLOSED Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays

We are working to hire new staff in order to offer additional service hours. We initially had a number of good applicants, however, several applicants that were offered positions declined, indicating that they had accepted positions elsewhere and some did not respond after being offered positions.

Building and Grounds

We continue to deal HVAC issues. Recently, a component on the air handler for the book stacks area on the first floor failed. An inspection was done for repair and the unit could not be powered on because air flow could not be controlled and the unit could only be powered on with the dampers 100% open, which caused too much air flow in the system and risked damaging other components. The component was replaced recently and operation restored, however, the display for the controlled for one boiler has failed and needs to be replaced, several boiler pipes are leaking (some have been repaired, others are pending), and the system in not currently responding to the settings in the control software. Diagnosis has begun for this last issue; however, the cause has not yet been determined.

I've met with members of the Township Environmental Advisory Council, Public Works and Engineering Departments to discuss a location at the library for a proposed rain garden project. The EAC is currently looking to secure grant funding for this and other projects. The current proposed location is near the Children's Department entrance.

I'm working with a company to put together a proposal for a new phone system for the libraries. A site survey was completed and it was determined that new wiring would need to be run for a network/cloud-based system that replaces the landline system we currently have. The existing landline

system we are currently using is prone to service interruptions during adverse weather and runs on Toshiba software that is no longer being directly supported by Toshiba. The project may end up with additional costs (due to the wiring needing to be addressed) than what was originally requested from the Township as a capital expense. I'm waiting on an update to the original quote which includes the wiring proposal and will work with the Township to determine how to complete the project. The new networked system is preferable to other systems as it enables some interoperability between the library building and the township administration building and can aid in establishing Tredyffrin Public Library as an emergency operations center.

Building Access

For the month of May, 5,578 Library visits were recorded.

The libraries initiated COVID-19 mitigation efforts in March of 2020. Comparing overall library visits in 2021 to 2020, visits are down 26,918 (-62%). There are no reasonable conclusions that can be drawn with comparing the door count this year to last year (due to hours of operations differences).

Circulation


Print circulation numbers increased slightly in May, however, borrowing of print materials remains at about 70% of typical borrowing levels pre-COVID. Borrowing of electronic materials remains high



although increases in other libraries spending on e-materials continues to increase. Contactless pickup totals continue to decrease as in-person browsing hours increase.

Print Circulation



2021 Circulation of Library Materials by Month




Circulation of Library Materials 2020 vs. 2021
